



First Lesson - Isaiah 43:8-13

The LORD calls us to be his witnesses to the truth that there is no God except for him.

He alone can save us from every evil.

⁸ Bring out the people who are blind, though they have eyes, and the people who are deaf, though they have ears. ⁹ Let all the nations be gathered together, and let peoples be assembled. Who

among them has declared this? Who has made known to us the former things? Let them produce their witnesses to show that they were right, so that people can hear and say, "This is truth."

¹⁰ You are my witnesses, declares the LORD. You are my servant, whom I have chosen, so that you may know me and believe in me, so that you will understand that I am he. Before me no god was formed, and after me there will not be another. ¹¹ I, yes I, am the LORD, and apart from me there is no savior.

¹² I myself declared it. I brought salvation, and I announced it. It was not some strange god among you. You are my witnesses, declares the LORD, and I am God. ¹³ Indeed, from the first day, I am he. There is no one who can deliver anyone from my hand. I act, and who can reverse it?

Second Lesson - 2 Timothy 1:3-10

Our vocations in life are all different. Yet, God puts us all in positions to testify to the gospel, which delivers us from evil.

³ I thank God, whom I serve with a clean conscience as my ancestors did, as I constantly remember you in my prayers night and day. ⁴ When I remember your tears, I long to see you, so that I may be filled with joy. ⁵ I remember your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am convinced that it also lives in you.

⁶ For this reason I am reminding you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. ⁷ For God did not give us a timid spirit, but a spirit of power and love and sound judgment. ⁸ So do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner. Instead, join with me in suffering for the gospel while relying on the power of God. ⁹ He saved us and called us with a holy calling, not because of our works, but because of his own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before time began, ¹⁰ and it has now been revealed through the appearance of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel.

Gospel / Today's Message - Mark 9:14-27

The Gospel according to Mark, chapter 9:

Glory be to you, O Lord!

Using only his words, Jesus demonstrates his authority over the evil one.

¹⁴ When they returned to the other disciples, they saw a large crowd around them, and some experts in the law were arguing with them. ¹⁵ As soon as all the people in the crowd saw Jesus, they were very excited and ran to greet him. ¹⁶ He asked them, "What are you arguing about with them?"

¹⁷ One man from the crowd answered him, "Teacher, I brought you my son, who has a spirit that makes him unable to speak. ¹⁸ Wherever it seizes him, it throws him down, and he foams at the mouth, grinds his teeth, and becomes rigid. I asked your disciples to drive it out, but they could not."

¹⁹ "O unbelieving generation," Jesus replied. "How long will I be with you? How long will I put up with you? Bring him to me."

²⁰ They brought the boy to Jesus. As soon as the spirit saw him, it threw the boy into a convulsion. He fell on the ground and rolled around, foaming at the mouth.

²¹ Jesus asked the boy's father, "How long has this been happening to him?"

"From childhood," he said. ²² "It has often thrown him into the fire and into the water to kill him. But if you can do anything, have compassion on us and help us."

- ²³ "If you can?" Jesus said to him. "All things are possible for the one who believes."
- ²⁴ The child's father immediately cried out and said with tears, "I do believe. Help me with my unbelief!"
- ²⁵ When Jesus saw that a crowd was quickly gathering, he rebuked the unclean spirit. "You mute and deaf spirit," he said, "I command you to come out of him and never enter him again!"
- 26 The spirit screamed, shook the boy violently, and came out. The boy looked so much like a corpse that many of them said, "He's dead!" 27 But Jesus took him by the hand, raised him up, and he stood up.

Keep us in the true faith, and bring us at last to the joys of heaven.





The Sacrament


The Lord be with you.
